# VTLS CHAMO DISCOVERY – a new online catalog

BUiD Library includes over 15,000 volumes of print books and is rapidly growing in collection including those purchased e-book titles directly link with the platform. To improve the discovery process within the online public access catalog (OPAC), we have introduced the new social web catalog – CHAMO DISCOVERY.

Chamo allows the users the type of self-service capabilities to expect through the web. Here are some of the benefits of the new online catalog.

- Provides powerful search functionalities to allow browsing and narrowing of results
- Users are guided with suggested search terms as well as the ability to do complex searching using the Advanced search option
- An improved interface when renewing items online
   There is an added feature if users want to request an item for purchase
- Using 'My Lists' where users can create a list, save it in a permanent file in their account and return to view it at any time
- RSS Updates where users can subscribe to an RSS feed of frequently changing content and receives updates when content changes
- The ability to view copies available to renew or to requests online



## Self-Service Password Reset Tool

The IT Department has installed a user managed self-service to unlock your windows login account or reset your login password based on the user answering the pre-registered security questions correctly. The feature allows an end user to

**Self-Password Reset:** self-reset his/her windows password or to unlock the account without calling for IT support.

**Self-Account Unlock**: Allows the end-users to selfunlock their locked down accounts.

**Change Password:** Grants end-users the permission to change their logon passwords.

**Self-Update:** Allows the end-users to self-update their profile.

# Meet our new IT staff


I'm Andres, the new IT Technician from Philippines. I earned my Bachelor's Degree in Information Management

# Teaching Kids to Think Critically by Dr Clifton Chadwick


This book is based on a simple series of psychological concepts. While ability to think has always been important, the knowledge economy significantly increases the demand for higher order thinking and problem-solving abilities. Parents should take a much more active role in teaching their children to think. Early preschool years are critical because long-term attitudes and early strategies are learned then. Approaches and perspectives on learning to think can be clearly communicated to parents in ways which will make it possible for them to use the correct strategies to stimulate their students to think more clearly and critically.

There are five elements involved in good, logical, critical, and creative thinking:

- 1. The skills involved in effective, efficient, and lasting learning, or commonly referred to as cognitive processing strategies
- 2. The mastery of logic and structure of what is being learned
- 3. Awareness of what one knows and does not know, and how one knows and how one thinks
- 4. The standards or guidelines for the validity and reliability of what one knows, called intellectual standards
- 5. The knowledge and skills involved in critical thinking and solving problems in different subjects or domains

## The Evolving Engagement Strategy By Dr Tamer Elewa

In today's world, several multinational organizations focus on employee engagement as one of their key objectives. While organizations invest a lot on engagement measurement and set global strategies to achieve higher levels of engagement, several executives challenge the effectiveness of the measurement tools and question if global strategies succeed in addressing the local engagement needs. What is employee engagement all about? Are global solutions credible enough to be applied in the Middle East? Are universal solutions possible? And are solutions "time-proof"? Why do HR and Business leaders just follow the status quo when dealing with employee engagement? Why do leaders just simply "buy" off-theshelf engagement surveys without asking themselves if the results will be valid? Is it worth the investment? This book combines the academic work as well as practitioners' experience and presents a solution to HR and business strategists on how to globalize engagement, while maintaining local sense.


